The Broncos had another good week going 2-0 and maintaining their #3 ranking in the latest NAIA National Polls. The first game of the week saw Hastings travel to York. They extended their winning streak to 7 games with an easy 89-68 win. The Broncos jumped out to a comfortable 41-27 half time lead shooting 45% from the field while holding York to 35%. The second half was closer with York shooting 60% from the field, but the Broncos still outscored York by 7 points. Lindsay Ducey led the team with 22 points and 11 rebounds. Kim Faimon was also very active tonight with 6 steals and 14 points.

The performance of senior, Lindsay Ducey, in the Midland game and York game earned her GPAC Player of the Week. Against Midland, Ducey had 23 points and 9 rebounds while shooting 100% for the evening. She was 8-8 from the field, 2-2 from the 3 point line, and 5-5 from the free throw line. Against York, Ducey had 22 points and 11 rebounds for an average on the week of 22.5 points and 10 rebounds.

The next game on the schedule was a battle against Concordia, a GPAC South Conference rival. The team won for the 8th time in a row beating Concordia 73-66. In the first half, the game was close the entire 20 minutes and went back and forth. Both teams led at one point or another in the first half with both teams largest lead being 7 points. Alicia Statler carried the Broncos early with 8 of the first 12 points. The Bulldogs then ended the half with a last second shot to make it a 35-34 game. In the second half, the Broncos did a better job of controlling the game and never trailed, and led by as many as 12 points. The Bulldogs ended the game with a desperation 3 pointer that went in to make the final score 73-66. The scoring was very even with Statler and Rachel Isherwood leading the team with 16 points, and Kim Faimon ending with 14 points. The Broncos take their 8 game winning streak and perfect conference record to Briar Cliff on Saturday.

Briar Cliff has started the season very strong with a 9-1 overall record and a 3-1 conference record. Most recently, the Chargers beat Dordt College 85-63. The Chargers moved into the national rankings last week at #21 and now have jumped up to #15. Liz Grider led the team with 26 points. The Chargers lead the conference in points per game with 88.6, assists per game with 16.11, steals per game with 17.22 per game, and turn over margin with a +7.44. They also have the leading scorer in the conference in Liz Grider with a 24.9 point average.
