Taylor Voycheske ended the scoring with her first and second goal on the year in the 75th minute and 85th minute.

And certainly felt in many ways that we deserved a result but that's futbol. We missed several sitters and they cleared the futbol off the line at least twice, so on a positive note we were able to get in behind them." For the defense, they continued to perform well and collected their 8th shutout of the year and have only conceded 2 goals on the year.
