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IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENTS PLEASE READ PRIOR TO REGISTERING FOR CLASSES.

- The Hastings College Catalog states under Academic Policies: “Although the Registrar’s Office and the adviser will assist the students with their planning, final responsibility for meeting degree requirements lies with the student.” Read and develop an understanding of your catalog requirements prior to registering for classes.
- Once you have registered for a course, it is the responsibility of the student to complete the course, or officially drop the course from your schedule at the Registrar’s Office. If a course is not dropped from your schedule, a grade of “F” will be recorded on your transcript.
- If you are a full-time student receiving financial aid, do not drop below full-time status (12 credit hours) without first checking with the Financial Aid Office in Hurley-McDonald Hall. Dropping to part-time status could cost you a great deal of money.
- Students participating in athletics must maintain full-time status (12 credit hours) to be certified and remain eligible. Do not drop below 12 hours minimum without checking with the Athletic Director.
- A full load is defined as 12-16 hours during the fall and spring semester and 3 hours during the J-Term. Students who wish to exceed these limits must have written approval from the Dean of the College (Academic Dean) and will be assessed overload charges. The INT 101 and 103 seminar courses are the only exceptions to the overload policy.
- Students who are registered for classes at Hastings College and wish to withdraw from the college must go through an official withdrawal process. This process involves the completion of a Withdrawal Form that can be obtained at the Registrar’s Office in Hurley McDonald Hall. To complete the withdrawal process students will be required to visit several administrative and academic offices listed on the Withdrawal Form. Failure to complete the Withdrawal Form in its entirety could delay the forwarding of academic records and hamper the student when applying for financial aid at subsequent schools. If a student has questions concerning the withdrawal process, please contact the Registrar’s Office or the Financial Aid Office, both located in Hurley-McDonald Hall.
- Federal regulation requires that certain information be made available to students on request, Graduation Rates, Campus Crime statistics and Equity in Athletics statistics and are available online at www.hastings.edu. The statistics are available by contacting the Business Office or Registrar’s Office in Hurley McDonald Hall. Notification of Rights under FERPA for Hastings College

The Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords students certain rights and protection with respect to their education records. They are:

1. **The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the day the College receives a request for access.** Students should submit to the Registrar, or other appropriate official, written requests that identify the record(s) they wish to inspect. The College official will make arrangements for access and notify the student of the time and place where records may be inspected.
2. **The right to request the education amendment of the student's records that the student believes is inaccurate or misleading.** Challenging a grade does not fall under the purview of FERPA regulations. The student may ask the College to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate or misleading. The student should make the request in writing to the Registrar; clearly identifying the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading. If the College decides not to amend the record as requested by the student, the College will notify the students of the decision and advise the student of his or her right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. A request for a hearing must be made in writing to the Vice President for Academic Affairs, who, within a reasonable amount of time will inform the student of the date, place and time of the hearing. The panel will include the Vice President for Academic Affairs, Vice President for Student Affairs, and Vice President for Enrollment Management.
3. **The student may not inspect certain records according to FERPA** including the following:
 - a) Financial information submitted by their parents.
 - b) Confidential letters and recommendations associated with admissions criteria, employment or job placement.
 - c) Honors to which the student has waived their rights of inspection and review.
 - d) Education records containing information about more than one student.
4. **The right of consent in writing to disclose personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except where FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.** The exceptions being:
 - a) School officials who have a "legitimate educational interests" as defined by FERPA.*
 - b) Parents of a dependent may request access as defined by the Internal Revenue Code.
 - c) A judicial order or subpoena which allows the in the College to release records without the students consent.
 - d) A person, company or organization providing financial aid or contracted by the College.
 - e) An accrediting agency carrying out their accreditation function.
 - f) To persons in an emergency in order to protect the health and safety of students or other persons.

*A College official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.
5. **The right to notify the College in writing (within two weeks of the beginning of each semester) if the student does not want any or all of the information designated as directory information to be released internally or externally.**

Registration Procedures

1. Make an appointment with your advisor who will assist you in developing your schedule. During the advising appointment, please use the shopping cart on MyHC to select courses.
2. Class status can be determined by using the section search on MyHC and looking at the available seats for each course. Registration information will be placed in the Campus Bulletin.
3. Class status is based on hours completed. First-year students are defined by having up to 26 hours. Sophomores are 27-56 hours. Juniors are 57-86 hours. Seniors are 87+ hours.

4. PART-TIME students (less than 12 hours) will begin registering as indicated on Monday, April 15. If you are a degree-seeking student in your last four semesters, contact the Registrar to be allowed to register at the correct time.
5. If you are on a Personalized Program, have Dr. Amyot check your schedule. You must have an approved program on file to register as a Personalized Program student. If changes are necessary in your program of study, you should file for an approval of those changes prior to registering for classes.
6. If you are registering for an Independent Study (470) or Directed Study (270/370), check with the Registrar's Office in advance about the eligibility requirements.
7. If you are registering for an Internship (290/490), you must meet eligibility requirements and your proposal must be approved in advance. See Ms. Graviette in the Career Services Office, Hazelrigg Student Union, for details.
8. Students who need to CHANGE ADVISORS when changing majors or for other reasons should make arrangements early in the advising period by contacting the Registrar's Office.

Supplements, containing additions, deletions, and revisions, will be posted in the fall of 2016.

Please read the information carefully, especially the policies listed under **GENERAL GUIDELINES** and **NOTES ON THE COURSE LISTINGS**. You are responsible for knowing about and abiding by these policies. Please contact the Vice President for Academic Affairs, the Registrar, or your advisor if you have any questions.

General Guidelines

1. The January Term is an integral part of the academic year and participation is required of all full-time students. **Students may, however, request one J-Term away from campus during their junior or senior year.** (See Course Listing **JAN 2017A** under Individualized Study Opportunities). All other exceptions to this policy may be made only by the Vice President for Academic Affairs. Tuition and fees (except for special course assessments) for January are included with semester charges.
2. **Three semester hours is considered a full load during January.** Anything over three hours will be considered an overload and overload charges will apply. Under no circumstances will a student be permitted to register for more than five hours.
3. Students are responsible for registering officially for whichever course they wish to take. Students will register online at your designated time. Students who register for a course and then fail to attend it, without officially dropping can expect to receive a grade of “F.”
4. All special assessments for individual courses (travel expenses, fees for special materials, etc.) must be paid in full in the Business Office. (Instructors of off-campus courses may set up their own payment schedules in cooperation with travel agencies; the deadline for final payment in such cases may be different.)
5. Also by the end of the fall semester, all students going off-campus during January **must** submit a signed **Release and Indemnity Agreement Form** to the Vice President for Academic Affairs.
6. All full-time Hastings College students, whether on or off-campus, are covered by an accident insurance policy financed through student fees. Part-time students, exchange students from other colleges, and non-students are not covered by this policy. Questions on insurance coverage and liability may be addressed to the Business Office.
7. Non-students—persons not registered for credit or audit—who participate in January tours are asked to make a per-person contribution of at least \$100.00 to Hastings College.
8. A major advantage of the 4-1-4 calendar is the possibility of **Intercollege Exchange** during the January Term. Students interested in this program should see the January director and should register for **J-Term 2017-January Exchange**. Participating schools include: **UMAIE, St. Olaf, Whitworth, Salem, Calvin, Austin, Erskine, Augustana, Berea, Univ. of Laverne, Washington and Jefferson, Eckerd, The Washington Center, Birmingham-Southern, Mercy, Bethel, Gustavus** and others.
9. Students may also participate in several other programs as well, including the **Chicago Center, Presbyterian Peacemaking Program, and University of Nebraska Medical Center Workshop for Pre-Health Profession Students**. Information on these programs is also available from the **Vice President for Academic Affairs**.

Notes on the Course Listings

Please read the COURSE LISTINGS carefully before you register. The following are guides to several of the individual items in the LISTINGS.

1. **DEPARTMENTS.** Note that some courses are cross-listed in two or more departments. For such courses, register in only one department.
2. **COURSE NUMBERS.** Some courses are listed with two course numbers—one for upper-division credit and one for lower-division credit. For such courses, register for only one number and note that upper-division credit, without exception, requires something extra from the student. If you have any questions, ask the instructor.
3. **LOCATION.** In the case of extended trip courses, this item lists the approximate duration and location of the trip. Assume that the rest of the time will be spent in on-campus study.
4. **APPLIES TOWARD.** Instructors have indicated if the course counts toward L.A.P. requirements, focus area or diversity, or if the course counts toward a departmental major.
5. **GRADING POLICY.** If the policy is P-F, it will count against your 16 hour pass-fail quota. First year students are eligible for such courses during January, and sophomores enrolled in such courses may take one additional class on a pass-fail basis during the academic year. If the Policy is A-B-C-D-F, you may take the course pass-fail if you are eligible. Remember that no course graded pass-fail may be applied toward the L.A.P., or toward a major or minor.
6. **EXTRA COSTS.** Travel expenses, lab fees, and film fees, are just some of the extra costs that may be required for a course. You should expect to buy a textbook in addition to whatever extra costs are listed.

Required Meeting: It is required that all students attend the preliminary meeting of January classes on **Friday, December 9**. Such things as course objectives, assignments, schedules, and meeting times will be established during these preliminary meetings. If you don't know what time your class meets, or if you have any questions at all about any course, ask the instructor.

“Nothing in biology makes sense except in the light of evolution.” However, evolution as it is now understood did not spring forth fully formed from the mind of Charles Darwin, nor has it remained unchanged since then. Ideas about the evolution of organisms existed prior to his proposal of a mechanism by which evolution might occur. Further, we know so many things that Darwin could not even have imagined that support and extend his ideas, and explain aspects of evolution far beyond Darwin’s great ideas. Through readings, discussions, and observations, we will examine the historical origins of those great ideas as well as learn where this fundamental theory of Biology is now. Spending 12 days in England, we will visit Darwin’s home, spend time in the British Museum of Natural History, and at the museum of the Linnean Society. Additionally, we will follow in the footsteps of Mary Anning as we collect fossils along England’s southern coast. A jump to the 20th century takes us to Cambridge and lunch at the Eagle Pub, where James Watson and Francis Crick announced that they had determined the structure of DNA.

Traditionally, when he touched the Stone of Destiny on the Hill of Tara, it let out a shriek that could be heard throughout the Island. Famously, we are told, he drove the Vikings out of Ireland. This course, which will include substantial time on the ground in Ireland, will simultaneously acquaint students with medieval and with modern Ireland. It will introduce students both to the confused and dangerous eleventh-century that produced the actual Brian and to the way that an often-distorted memory of Brian has come to become part of contemporary Irish identity.

The class will focus primarily on the comparison of national security regimes in Guatemala and Argentina.
